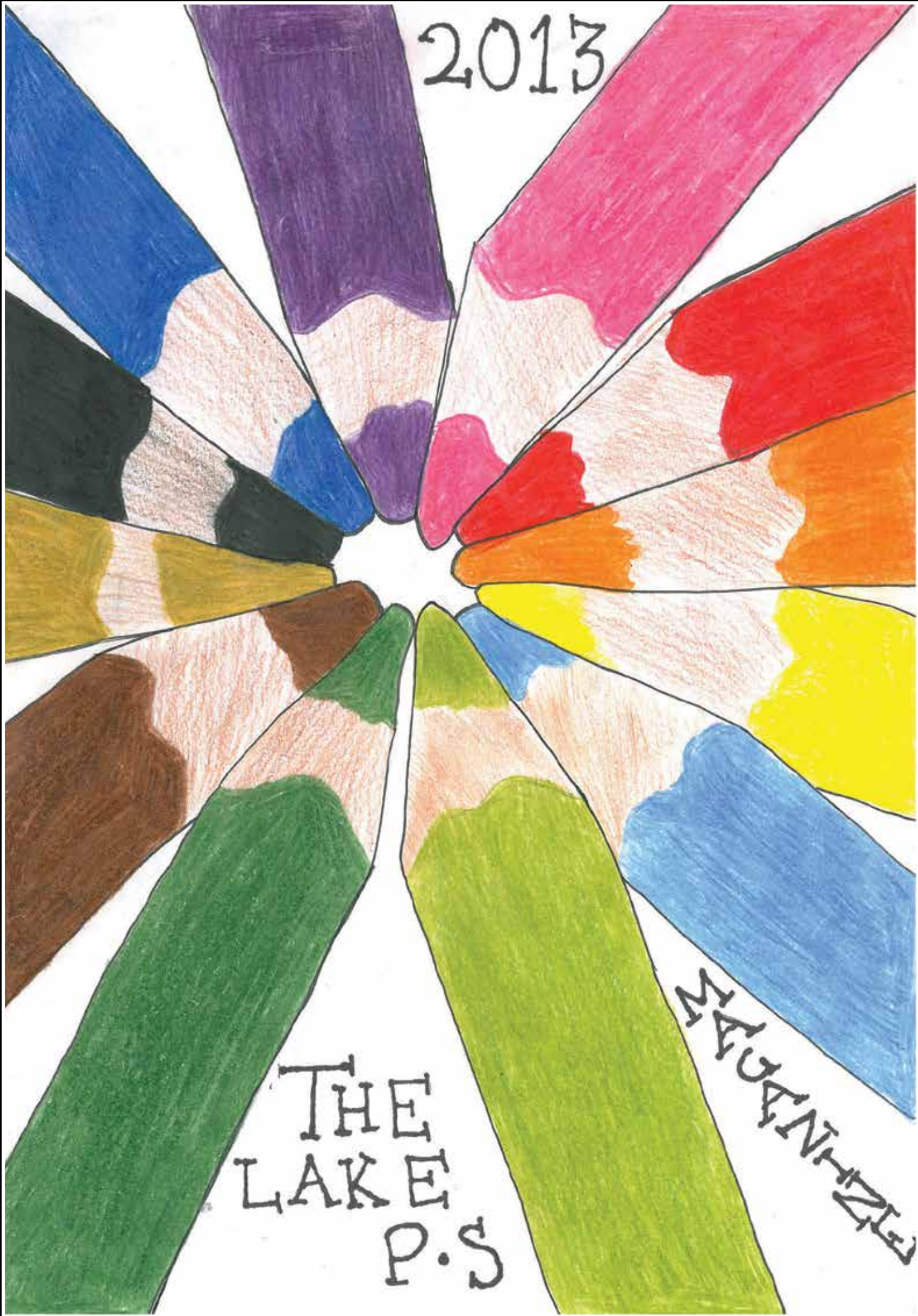

2013 has been another highly successful year for our school. The Lake Primary School continues to grow in size and reputation. Enrolments exceeded 200 for the first time in the school's history. My congratulations to Ms McNair, Mrs Bacon, Ms Kerridge, staff and students. This year's school magazine captures many of the exciting educational and community events that mark a memorable period in our school's 105 year history.



This year Mr Adam Parsons joined the school as our second Leading Teacher (Numeracy). Miss Mia Humphrey commenced as a 3/4 classroom teacher after graduating from Latrobe Uni. A Primary Welfare Officer role was also introduced with firstly Ms Rebecca Reale and then Ms Bonney Dietrich contributing each Tuesday and Wednesday. Ms Tracy Kerridge enjoyed a new role as the Reading Recovery/SELL teacher and achieved outstanding results. Our staff team has grown to 21 in 2013. We have a great, hard working, supportive and professional team and I thank each staff member for their valued contributions throughout the year.

My congratulations to our fantastic students. Our school leaders Aydn, Gemma, Jackson & Sarah have been positive role models for our students. I have particularly enjoyed the opportunity to work closely with our 24 Yr. 6 students each Friday in the 'Lakers Learning to Lead' program. This group ranks with the nicest bunch we have had in my time at the school. I wish them well as they move onto their secondary destinations.

Highlights for 2013 include Miss Toni's 5/6 Choir placing first in the Mildura Eisteddfod for the second year running and once again being awarded the prestigious Charlotte M Harvey Memorial trophy. The 'Steps 4 Eva' fundraising event raised an amazing \$30,000 to support young Eva Wheatley and her family in Eva's ongoing battle with cancer. Local community worker John Burfitt provided incredible support for this event. Our school won the Inter-School Cluster Athletics Sports. JSC was once again very active organizing a number of fundraisers. The school's major fundraiser raised a commendable \$10,000. Mrs Bacon and her team did an incredible job organizing the fun games night! The proceeds have been allocated towards an exciting new adventure playground, additional upgrades to our parent car park and preliminary works in organising a new school oval area. Major trips to Canberra (5/6s) and Swan Hill (3/4s) were memorable highlights for the students. The students enjoyed a range of exciting visiting performances. NAIDOC Day, Indonesian & Book Week Activity Mornings, Allergy Awareness and Footy Colours Day were popular events with students.

My thanks to our supportive Parents' Club who raised thousands of dollars once again for our students. The School Council provided clear and consistent guidance and support which made my role so much easier.

Finally, it is always a privilege to lead the school and I sincerely thank all members of our wonderful school community for their interest, contributions and support. Best wishes to all families and staff that may be leaving the school. [The Lake School is a great school!](#)

2013 has been a year full of many highlights for The Lake Primary School.

The Trivia/Games night was a great success with everyone in attendance having a fantastic night. The night raised approximately \$10,000, which has financed several projects, the major one being the development of the adventure playground. This has given the front of the school a unique and novel transformation and the children have certainly embraced this different style of play area.

The car park underwent 2 upgrades this year with extensive asphaltting, line marking, kerbing, signage and bollards added. The car park has improved significantly in size, useability and most importantly safety in the last two years.

At the beginning of the year the school made a significant investment in the purchase of 10 new iPads and 50 new Netbooks. These have been used extensively throughout the year, proving to be a great asset to the teaching program.

It is exciting to see the progress made with the new relocatable classrooms. These will be a fantastic addition to our steadily growing school in 2014.

Planning for development of the new school oval/play area has begun. This will be a major project that will take a lot of time and funds to complete. Work on the first stages of this project will hopefully commence in early 2014.

I would like to thank all staff, parents and students for all their hard work over the last 12 months. I would also like to personally thank School Council members, Parents' Club members and parents who have volunteered their time to contribute to the school. Also, thanks to Rod for his continued commitment and dedication in going the extra mile.

Finally, I would like to say "Congratulations and Good Luck" to our Grade Six graduating class.

2013 Choir



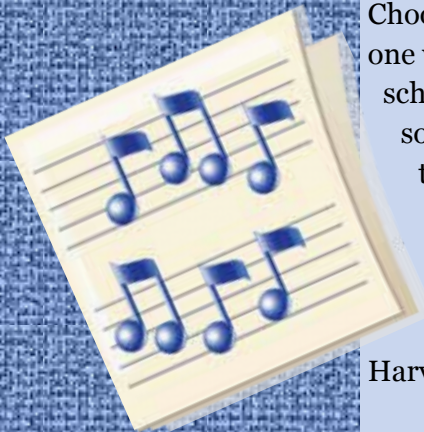

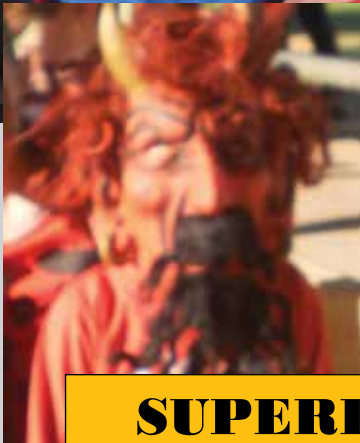


The Lake's Got Talent Community Evening

FOOD ALLERGY WEEK 2013

Food allergies continue to increase at alarming rates.

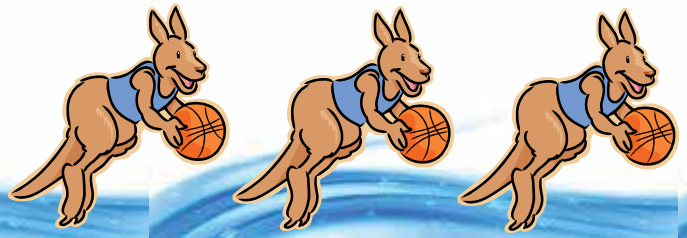
1 in 10 infants now have a food allergy. The most common food allergies for children are cow's milk, egg, peanut and tree nut. The foods that trigger 90% of food allergic reactions in Australians include cow's milk, egg, peanut, tree nut, sesame, soy, wheat, fish and shellfish. Peanut, tree nut, fish, shellfish and sesame allergy are usually lifelong.

Triggers cannot be removed, but can be managed. The 1 in 10 babies with food allergies need to be cared for in a community that has greater understanding and awareness of food allergy. Individuals at risk of anaphylaxis and those caring for them must know how to reduce the possibility of a reaction and be able to recognise and treat a reaction when it happens. Our students participated in activities to raise allergy awareness. We painted one fingernail to highlight that one in ten babies born will develop an allergy as well as having our annual SUPERHERO FRIDAY where children had the opportunity to dress up as a Superhero to show that we can all be heroes and help those with allergies.





Basketball Clinic



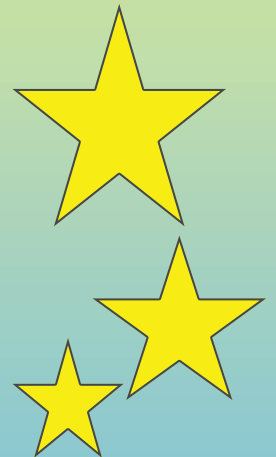

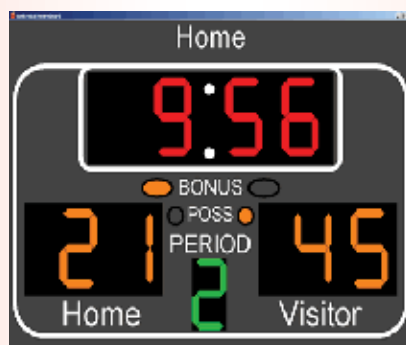
Soccer:

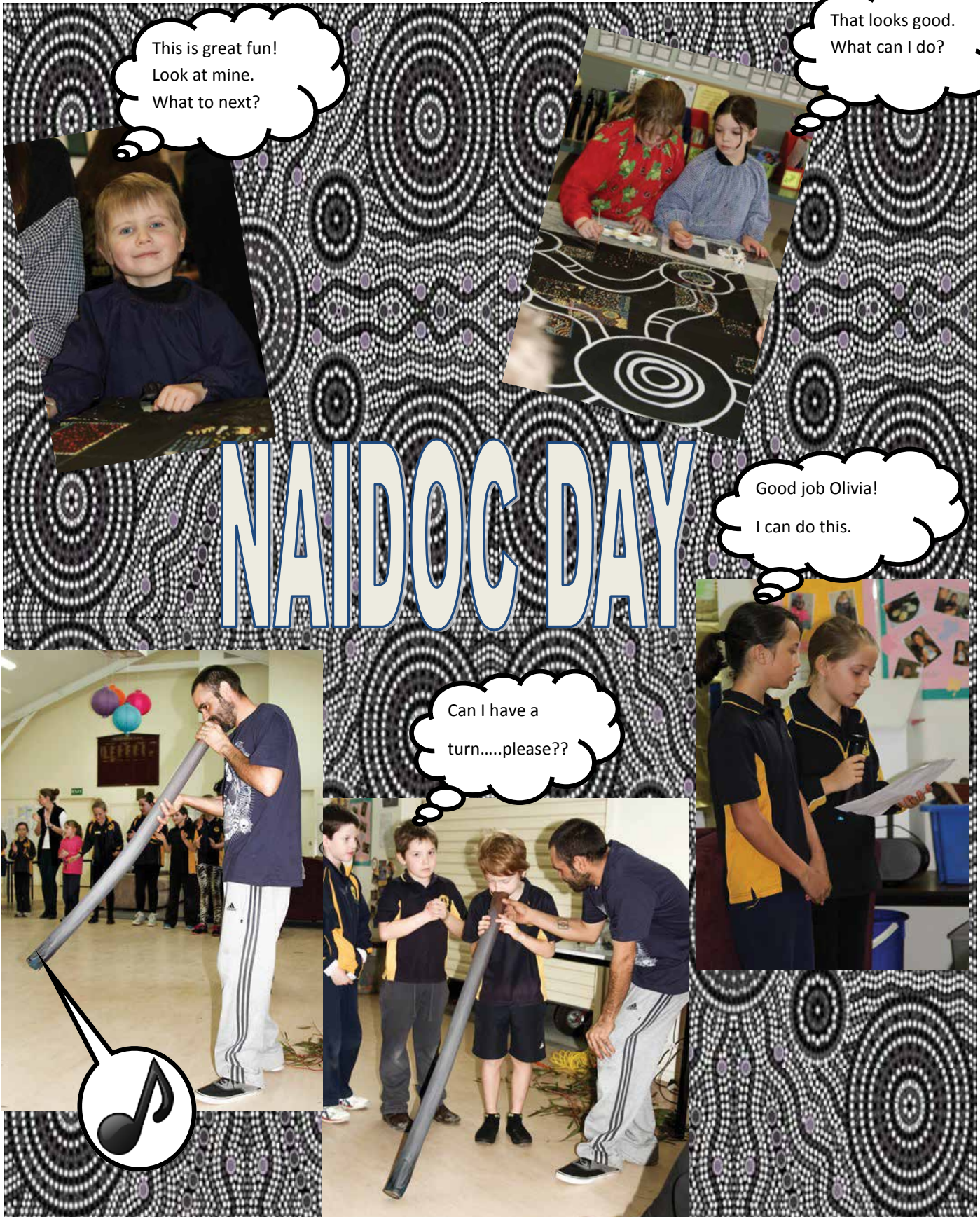

These bite-size mini muffins from Amie Langstaff of Painesville Township, Ohio, will be a favorite with family and friends. It's a great recipe to make when you want to use up overripe bananas.

PREP: 20 MIN. BAKE: 15 MIN/BATCH YIELD: 36 SERVINGS (72 MUFFINS)

- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup plus 1 tablespoon sugar, divided
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup mashed ripe bananas
- 2/3 cup peanut butter
- 1 tablespoon milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup miniature semisweet chocolate chips

In a large bowl, cream butter and 1 cup sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in the bananas, peanut butter, milk and vanilla. Combine the flour, baking soda and salt; add to creamed mixture just until moistened. Fold in chips.

Fill greased or paper-lined miniature muffin cups three-fourths full. Sprinkle with remaining sugar. Bake at 350° for 14-16 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool for 5 minutes before removing from pans to wire racks.

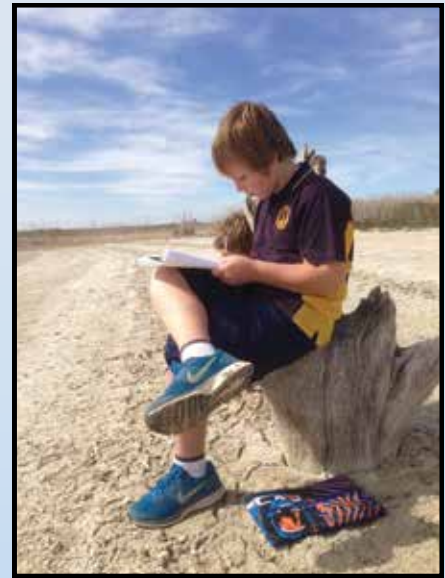
